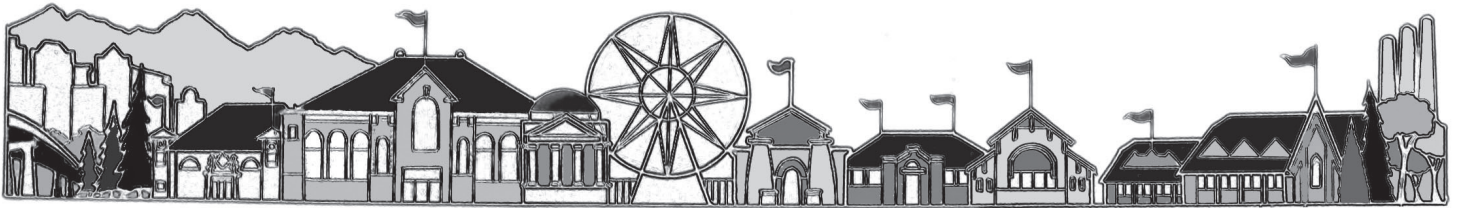

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Free Computer Classes at Northwest Community Center

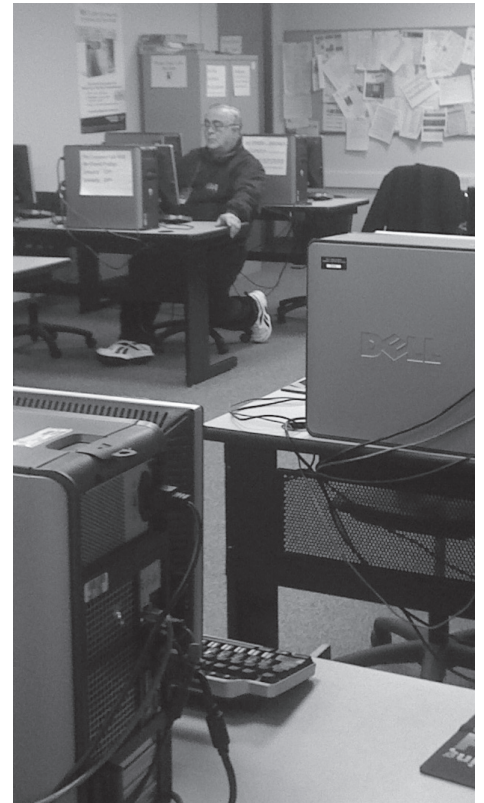
If you want to upgrade your computer skill for work, looking for new employment, or just not having to ask your kids for help, you might want to check out the free computer classes offered at the Northwest Community Center (1300 West 300 North).

The Community Access to Technology (CAT) Program offers "hands-on" classes at the Center's computer lab. Topics include Microsoft Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Outlook, using Windows format. There are also classes on using the internet and internet job search. Beyond class training, participants can also receive one-on-one instruction.

Volunteers in Technical Assistance (VITA) will be available to help with tax preparation coming in February.

The computer lab is opened Monday through Friday from 10 am to 4 pm. Evening hours, Monday through Thursday, are 6 pm to 8 pm.

Meeting Minutes for December 1st

Executive committee in attendance: Gordon Storrs, Marialice Jones, Steve Johnson, Bryce Garner, Jordan Jones, Gina Zivkovic, and Michael Barnes.

1. Gordon S opened the meeting and thanked everyone for contributing to the potluck.
2. Gina Z moved to approve the minutes from last month, Marialice J seconded, the motion carried.
3. Ashley Hillman from United Way Community Learning Center discussed activities at Mountain View Middle School and Glendale Middle School.
4. The floor was opened for community input. Jordan J talked about setting up an urban garden on county land near the Northwest Community Center. He passed around a petition of support. Gina Z talked about Calle de Comida and a walking bridge over the railroad tracks at 300 North. Steve J brought up an upcoming Rocky Mountain Power planned outage for the area. Gordon S attended the NeighborWorks annual meeting and reported on it.
5. Gordon S gave a special thanks to Van Turner, the City councilman for District 2, for his twelve years of service. Van was presented with a gift from the community council. He said a few words.
6. Charlotte Fife reported about the Westview newspaper. The Westview started 10 years ago--after a six year hiatus, it is back in circulation. The Westview is funded by a CBDG grant, and other sponsors.
7. Michael Stott, Mayor's office liaison report--The city may put in a traffic signal on Redwood Road and 300 North because pedestrians are finding it hard to cross in that area. Answering a question from a previous meeting about park bathrooms being closed in the winter--he said that the pipes will freeze, and thus the bathrooms cannot be open. There are a number of open issues at open city hall online. Residents reported on street lights that are out.
8. It was announced that Rendon Court and the new Biomat Building have begun construction.
9. Jordan J motioned to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Steve J, and the meeting was adjourned.

NEIGHBORHOOD SPOTLIGHT:

North Temple: becomes newest RDA Zone

In October of last year, the City Council, acting as the Salt Lake Redevelopment Board moved to create the North Temple Project Area. This was the culmination of years of prep work on the part of the Redevelopment Agency staff.

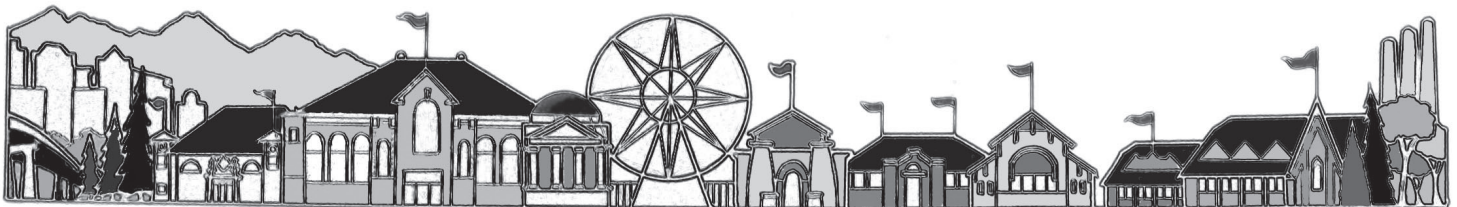
The North Temple Project Area will roughly encompass the area one block north and two blocks south of North Temple from I-15 to Redwood Road. The project area is expected to last for 25 years and will use 75% of the tax increment over that time period (estimated at \$56 million) to redevelop the area, with the goal of revitalizing the North Temple corridor and maximizing transit-oriented redevelopment.

In 2010, Salt Lake City created the North Temple Boulevard Plan to guide land use decisions that would maximize transit investments for the community. The Plan provides urban renewal standards that focus on transit-oriented development, walkability, housing, density, sustainability and safety. Shaped after the Boulevard Plan, the North Temple Project Area Plan will help to revitalize and improve the North Temple corridor by encouraging transit-oriented development, increasing density and housing options, and creating long term economic stability in the area.

One specific goal identified in the North Temple Project Area Plan is to redevelop the Folsom Corridor between 800 West and 1000 West, which will incorporate the daylighting of the flow of the City Creek Corridor. The development will include a pedestrian and bicycle pathway that will connect to the Jordan River. The RDA will also pursue environmental assessment activities in the formative years of the project to better characterize the health of the landscape and determine future potential development opportunities.
