# Fairpark Folks to Finally Board TRAX

Fairpark Community and City to Celebrate on April 13

Saturday, April 13th, is the day to celebrate, at last, the long-anticipated opening of the Airport TRAX Line. It might be said that no other project, except the completion of the I-15 that isolated Fairpark and other Westside communities from the rest of the City, will have as great an impact on the Fairpark Community as TRAX.

On April13th, the main event will be a ribbon-cutting at the new TRAX station below the Viaduct at 500 west (ride the escalator!). But for Fairpark Community residents, the festivities begin earlier in the day. Starting at 10 am, and continuing at 15 minute intervals until 10 pm, people can experience the new TRAX route with free rides to the new Airport Station (please bring a can of food for the Utah Food Bank). Each of the four new TRAX stations will be offering music, activities, and treats and, for the first 500 people, free funnel cakes at the Utah State Fairpark.

So take a free ride on the new TRAX. Join your neigh-

bors and local businesses in the celebration. Get to know the four new TRAX stations that will be a significant part of the Fairpark Community for decades to come: **North Temple Bridge/Guadalupe** (500 westground level, stairs and escalators to the top of the viaduct) **Jackson Euclid** (800 West), **Fairpark** (1150 West), and **Power** (1480 West).



# Neighborhood Will Change with Proposed Zoning Amendment

If a requested amendment to current zoning is approved by the Planning Commission and the City Council, the interior of the block south of Backman Elementary will be significantly changed with the construction of a new subdivision (see map). The developer plans to build approximately 31 single-family homes on about 2.5 acres. For this to happen, the area's current zoning, R-1/7000 Single Family Residential Area, must be changed to a SR-3 Special

Residential Development area. Current zoning requires minimal lots of 7000 square feet. The new zoning will allow 2000 square-foot lots.

The discussion on this issue began at last month's Fairpark Community Council meeting and is scheduled to continue at this month's meeting. A possible outcome is the Council will formally adopt a position on the proposed zoning change to be conveyed to the Planning Commission.

### Grab and Go Kits
