Van Turner visited to talk about his candidacy for City Council . He said Fairpark Community Council is the strongest community council because it is represented by three City Council districts. Married, and also owns small businesses on the west

Has worked on parks initiatives. He is a family guy. Worked on the Northwest Rec Center, the Sorenson Center. Has worked in a lot of capacities on the council, including as Chair and as

Andrew Johnston – professionally is a social worker

Why he is running – homeless services, worked for many years with Volunteers of America.

The Recreational Bond – number of projects, including Folsom corridor

Family safety – lighting, policing, 900 West as Redevelopment

Question on where to locate the housing – Andrew wants to distribute housing across the county. Only area zoned for facilities is between 300 west and the freeway from 200 south to approximately 1000 south

Van doesn't want to see the homeless people locate in concentrations. Wants to address it at the state level, not just the county. Van volunteers at the halfway houses.

Question = Talk about eminent domain to flip a troubled property for up to 5 years.

Van wants businesses to be kept whole and treat businesses well.

Andrew wants to use eminent domain judiciously. Is open to looking at eminent domain. Thinks the market is going to push people out.

Presentation on 300 North Study

Robin Hutcheson, SLC Transportation Director

The community applied for and was awarded for 300 North Transmodal study to look at issues. The problems in connectivity, largely due to freight and Bike and pedestrian bridge. A lot of children in the neighborhood. Work can be completed in house so that the funds can go toward building. Going to apply for Federal funds to apply for the bridge.

Motion: made by Marcy approve recommendation made all in favor

Issues and opportunities: Southern side of the road; closer proximity to TRAX and FrontRunner. UTA is supportive and Union Pacific wants this to happen, as well.

Well connected – 300 North has a lot of opportunity.
