City Council Members Report

District 2: Councilman Andrew Johnston reported on mixed income housing at 750 West near freeway. That was falsely reported.

Also, looking at developing at 999 West I -80.

Bryce identified a discrepancy in TSA zoning between Permative Supportive Housing and TSA zoning.

Maria was at a working group. Affordable housing distribution – a little over 1,000 affordable housing units; with over ½ in gated facilities.

District 1: Councilman James Rogers reported that the brown cans are resuming service next week!

Now the city has an interlocal agreement with the County has included raccoon abatement.

Prison and Northwest Master Plan. Legislature is looking at revoking the option for sales tax in the municipality housing the prison.

Tom made a comment on the lack of grounds upkeep on state roadways. Lights on No Temple between 600 - 800 West are out.

Legislative Update

Representative Sandra Hollins is out ill

Senator Luz Escamilla – Senator Escamilla is hopeful about the Fairpark this session. One issue is about the lack of the lease options. State Bill 173 is being run by Senator van Tassel, addresses the governance of the fairpark board. Previously no transparency on the board. An added amendment will include two business reps (by gov), two agriculture reps (by gov), SLC Mayor rep. Luz would also like to see a community representative.

There is likely to be some appropriations for the Fairpark to the tune of \$2 million.

Maria asked about the potential loss of taxes with prison – Hillyard is the one pushing removing it.

Housing bill – SB 192 – affordable housing – section 8 housing. Bill seeks to remove the protection of source of income. Criminal Justice reform will be a discussion item during interim session.

General fund revenue is lower than anticipated.
