Councilman Andrew Johnston – D2

Discussed the importance of reporting suspicious activity. Must let the city know about issues that neighbors are aware of. SLC
Mobile is a great app for reporting non-emergency activity.

RDA budget transfers, over \$120M in the budget and parts of that budget are not attached to other projects currently. They found
\$15-20M that they would like to put towards the affordable housing crisis.

Staff will be reviewing budget recommendations to ensure they aren't creating problems in other areas.

\$12M was set aside to purchase new resource centers

Will there be public input? Yes.

Will affordable housing be spread out through the city? Money was set aside for purchasing property on east side of city to spread
this out through the city.

300 N funding is should almost all approved

New homeless sites coming forward soon in the next few weeks – public input will be accepted in late November

impacts you.

Expecting 28,000 new residents in the next 10 years

Homeless Site Selection- 11/21 is the date that was identified as the date for releasing sites

Today the parks and open spaces dept. Jordan River Parkway – Grant submitted for a 10 year plan on developing Nate is leaving D2 and moving into a leadership role with the liaisons taking over for D7, Moana will be taking over for D2

Sen Escamilla – Interim community meetings happening now, a very successful fair this year, the arena is under construction and will be complete in July. Lots of other opportunities coming to the west side.

Lots of discussion about the Operation Diversion in Rio Grande – because funding is coming from the state, Sen Escamilla has been fighting that these sites have do not go on the west side

Opiate Overdose is a crisis right now and significantly high substance abuse issues, many children under the age of 18, this disproportionality hurts low income areas like the west side

She has requested an audit on the SLC School District and this is a good thing

State Prison Update – There is a separate committee that is working on the construction aspects – the site has been selected

She is now on the Senate Oversight Committee for the Fairpark

Fred Johnson is running for Senate District 1 – You can look up more on Fred Johnson for Senate on Facebook

Luz Escamilla is running to retain her seat in the Utah State Senate
