Action Items

1. Welcome, Announcements, Introductions

- West side Festival - June 22, Sugarspace
- Lions Club Breakfast - Riverside Park, Saturday May 25 - 8am
- Salt Lake City and other districts in need of bus drivers and bus attendants - good part time job (Attendants start at 12-13 dollars/hour; Training provided for bus drivers)

2. Public Safety Report

SLCPD - Det. Curdie, Community Intelligence Unit

- Part 1 crimes (most severe - felonies) - down 31.5% over last 28 days. No significant events.
- Part 2 crimes (less severe) - 1.3% (slight increase) - substantial increase in DUI related offenses.
- District 1 hot spot for residential and non-residential burglaries. Mostly apartment or home settings - mostly 6am-12pm - Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- Electronics, yard equipment, bikes most common stolen items.
- Shootings - Gateway Inn, Jackson Elem., Redwood Road and Independence Blvd.
- Partnered with National Insurance Crime Bureau - 200 devices with certain qualifications regarding dupe of vehicle.
- Gateway Inn stats - Trending upward - shootings have impacted coverage increase of area - 26 calls for service in March-slight increase but still significant decrease from a year ago.
- April - 19 calls for service

3. City Elected Officials Report

Andrew Johnson -

- Folsom Trail Corridor - RDA met with Justin..... on Daylight Study.
- 3rd north pedestrian overpass - fully funded except for Union Pacific - 500k commitment- once that is done the project will move forward
- Fisher Mansion - the money mentioned above will be used to restore the Carriage House.
- Working on Funding for Fisher Mansion.

- 5th and 6th North - City reported to Council on traffic studies and safety studies. **Suggests to have transportation department come present (John Larsen)**
- Parks - Mayor has recommended a Ranger program - at this point has been put into the police department. Uniformed Officers would serve as rangers in the parks. Slight concern about the perception of having uniformed officers. More discussion ensuing.
- Sales Tax increase - public safety, streets, affordable housing, transportation. Improved bus service between airport and University (1st phase).
- Streets will be repairing or reconstructing in next 5 years. 3rd west is one big project. There is a map with a layout of projects. **Suggest to have Jennifer McGrath come present.**
- Permanent Speed bumps off the table because snow plows and fire equipment have difficulty with them. **Pioneer precinct of SLPD has temporary speed bumps for use for the summer. Will put them up at points on 500 North and also on 1300 West/400 North. Residents can make a request through "Speedwatch" on the SLPD website.** John Larsen from the city will be focusing on 5th north along with 6th north. Residents pointed out that there are more houses facing the street on 500 north than there are on 600 north.
- **Suggested for FCC to write a CIP for permanent traffic calming measures.**
- Rank Choice Voting is being looked at - probably next year will be voted on by City Council.

4. Mayor's Report

Elaine Navar – Community Liaison

- Answer to question from last meeting - Impact fees for Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) - \$9,000 for stand alone ADU built out of a shipping container= standard fee.
- Mayor proposed general fund budget (330 Million) - overall growth of 28 million. 1 million recommended for restoration of Fisher Mansion Carriage House. 400,000+ allocated for Jordan River Park improvements and events.
- Trips to Transit - on demand ride services in low density neighborhoods to transit stations. There is a survey on SLC.gov/transportation/trips to transit

More people need to complete the survey. Survey is open until the end of June.

- Freedom Loop - A Hike to Remember - Memory Grove on Memorial Day, May 27 - 1.5 mile hike. Will begin at 8:30am.
