Problem with many being resource resistant – they want to live in camps.

## 3. **Mayor's Office Report** Josh Rebello

New organization within the police department – beginning in January

Josh displayed an organizational chart

Community based organization – community rep within the police department

Now an officer over districts 1 and 2 – that person will report directly to the Pioneer division

Det. Oliver will continue to be the person who we will work with and between him and the captain of the Pioneer Division will attend our meetings.

Dec, 19 clothing drive at city council building – old coats, clothing, etc. drop off 11am-3pm (see City social media for announcement)

### Citizen Concerns:

841 West 300 North– home that has people coming and going 24/7 – trash, open sewer lines, etc.

Community Action Team (CAT) is working on this problem.

Jordan River Homeless Encampments from Fisher Mansion North – seems to be no mitigation efforts, or efforts not working.

Josh – meetings occurring with prioritizing areas of the city. He and Andrew will follow up

North Temple – weekly meeting at corner of N. Temple and 800 west Fridays at 4 – 30 minutes

Oz Development –Owners of Arctic Circle – demolition planned and breaking ground for

5-6 story buildings, 300 SqF studios, housing above

Gateway Inn ownership – redevelopment opportunities. More info in future.

Farmers Market at Fairgrounds – construction as soon as next summer, maybe May

James Rogers has been doing a lot of work on the Farmers Market – first year around public market in Salt Lake.

Demolition ordinance has been changed – to make it easier to get buildings demolished that are eyesores and not functional.

Continuing work with the county to address homelessness. Opening an emergency shelter for winter months.

Dockless scooter ordinance – sets out a broad policy area with agreements with two scooter companies having elusive rights to Salt Lake and thus more regulations

Google Fiber installation and 5g towers being installed – public utilities allow companies to put up structures in public right of way wherever they feel it is necessary. The city does have a comprehensive notification to residents. Working on an ordinance that will more tightly regulate this with citations for not notifying residents in advance of the construction.

Police reform initiatives – body camera ordinance, expanding police civilian review board, streamlining disciplinary practices

2021 – Fleet block will be redeveloped and transformative for that neighborhood.

Initiative to work on informing communities about vaccines.

Affordable housing and zoning changes work and housing loss ordinance

6. **KOZO Project – Dallin Jolley – canceled – delayed at airport**

Development that has been approved – 200 north (ish) 600 west

Citizens concerned about the impact on the neighborhood about the traffic flow and no overflow parking (150 cars). There is no compatible transition into the neighborhood.
