4. City Council – Andrew Johnston via Nigel Swaby: Still working on North temple issue. Meeting at 4pm on Friday at corner of 8th west and North Temple. He will talk to David Wright about the 29th Ward property (Andrew does not want to see it demolished.)

5. Healthcare Access at clinics in 84116, changes – Nathan Peterson, Intermountain Healthcare Community Health Team – Nathan.peterson@imail.org oversight of two Rosepark clinics (North Temple clinic and clinic at Rosepark Elementary School. Conducting an assessment (via interviews and meetings) of the services being provided in the community. Community input desired over the next month. (Email in chat) Working with the SLC School District. Plan to offer a tele-health program through the schools – would cover every school in the district.

6. North Temple Development – Nick Norris, Salt Lake City Planning Division Director Planning is part of the Community and neighborhood department in the city, which handles all the aspects of building and growth and development in the city. (gave presentation with slides). Planning handles applications and permits and subdivisions, historic preservation. (Not parks and public lands or transportation.)

Provided a “Planning and Zoning 101”, eg., Zoning maps; Naming of zoning districts; Master plans (guiding documents – don’t establish law, etc. - to help understand the challenges in the issues over time. Used to help implement city goals and policies).

Zoning – establishes the rules of how land is developed and used.

Projects

Housing development where Artic Circle – 4 stories, going to 900 west 1600 West N. Temple -

Rose Garden petition denied – plans did not meet the zoning standards

700 housing units on old Diamond Parking (airport lots) – approved in December by planning commission.

Kozo house – 200 North 600 West – went to commission because of the length of the building.

Planning commission denied because it was too long – revising. Plan is to replace existing housing that are occupied. Parking issues with this development has also been a point of contention. Parking requirements in city – an assessment is in process and community needs to provide input.

Affordable housing overlay is being worked on by the city.

Open houses are online now and engagement has exponentially increased as a result (vs. in person)
