**June 23, 2022**

**6:30 pm Welcome and Announcements** – Nigel welcomes people. This is a hybrid meeting so we are having a few technical problems with the Zoom.

Development Committee- No one here to report

Homeless Committee- Chaise, nothing solid to report. Nigel, City Council had put a moratorium on building new resource centers. Nigel says the zoning that allows them needs to be expanded so they don't just end up in the same neighborhoods concentrated on westside.

**6:35 Public Safety Report** – North Temple issues- Det. Oliver took questions about North Temple and 800 W. Recovered a stolen vehicle and a bank robber captured. Leticia informs Detective Oliver that 1200 W. is beginning to see a lot of car racing, etc. once again. Det. Oliver said video or photos is good to try to get so they can use to identify people. Det. Oliver announces that Comstat page has changed a little to make it easier to read, people encouraged to go check out stats there. Det. Oliver gave stats for District 1, District 2, and District 3. Stats are not dramatically different, up in some stats down on others. Question about license plate reader cameras.

**6:55 Mayor's offices**- Josh Robello reported fire marshal put out firework restriction map it is much broader than previous years, you can see map at [slcfire.com](http://slcfire.com). Laser show at Jordan park and Liberty park so no fireworks will happen this year. Talked about adopt a storm drain program. Question about what you should do if you see illegal fireworks. Chicago street will be closed for the State Fair again this year.

**7:15 Community Discussion:**

**Affordable Housing Overlay**- Nigel talked about how this will increase density. Executive Board submitting a letter to Planning Commission reporting our concerns. Concern about teaming up with east side neighborhoods to oppose because we oppose for different reasons.

Nigel asks if anyone opposed to removing the affordability component of the overlay. Dave is not sure he wants to strip it completely. Majority of folks are in favor of opposing overlay.

**ASPIRE, NSF engineering research center** – educational research specialist, Fawn Groves. Transportation, air quality, etc. USU in national center for ASPIRE. Charged to work on vehicular electrification and equitable transportation. They want to help inland port to electrify fleet, etc. Trying to assemble a Westside Advisory Board.

**Suzanne Harrison – County Council candidate** spoke to FCC. Medical doctor and mom, she wants to hear about our concerns and thinks it in time for a change since Richard Snelgrove has been in office for such a long time. Air quality is a big issue with here. Crime is a big issue in our neighborhood.

Question from council- Nigel asked about county's role in crime prevention in our neighborhood. What is county's role for homelessness issue? She will help find funding and help work at root of the problem. Question about how she would interact with constituents. Suzanne pledged to be responsive. Question about masked mandate and experimental drug injection. Suzanne responded she supports medical research and local support. Councilmember Puy spoke on homeless issues and need for county support. Keiko asked about what questions need to be addressed at the county rather than the county.

**My Home Town-** day of service, 100 volunteers that worked on houses and Buddhist Temple. Sept. 10<sup>th</sup> will be another service day, 8am to noon.
